

## WMU 300 Elk Special Licence

### Drawn Applicants –Hunting Information

A WMU 300 Elk Special Licence may be valid for an antlerless elk or for a 3-point or larger antlered elk, whichever is specified on the licence. See the current *Alberta Guide to Hunting Regulations* for description of 3-point elk. Hunting Areas 300A and 300B are outlined on the accompanying map, and your licence will be designated for and valid in only one of them and only during the specified season.

WMU 300 borders Waterton Lakes National Park (see map on reverse). If a wounded animal enters the Park, you must contact the Park warden staff by checking at the Park entrance, or phoning 1-888-WARDENS or (403) 859-2636

**IT IS ILLEGAL TO HUNT, CHASE OR DISTURB WILDLIFE IN WATERTON LAKES NATIONAL PARK AT ANY TIME.**

If travelling into the Park for any reason, be aware that firearms are prohibited in national parks, except on through highways and in townsites, where they must be unloaded, encased, or dismantled. No off-highway travel of motor vehicles is permitted in Waterton Lakes National Park.

#### Access

Most hunting in WMU 300 is on private land, hence permission from landowners is required (see "Hunting privileges on occupied, private and public land" in the current *Alberta Guide to Hunting Regulations*). Municipal maps that show the locations and names of landowners may be obtained from the following:

- For WMU 300A (north and west of the Waterton river), Municipal District of Pincher Creek No.9, 753 Kettles Street, Pincher Creek, 627-3130
- For WMU 300B (south and east of the Waterton River), Municipal District of Cardston No. 6, 455 Main Street, Cardston, 653-4977

Landowners appreciate being contacted for permission to hunt in advance of your hunting trip. Not all landowners in WMU 300 permit hunting, and their policies may differ regarding off-road travel and use of off-highway vehicles on their land. Some landowners may permit walking access only.
